Revenue and other metrics from 2011 to 2017


The Friends of Burlington County Animal Shelter enhance the lives of shelter animals and help them find homes. We also help reduce the number of homeless animals in our community by sponsoring a low-cost spay/neuter program.

Since the founding of the Friends of BCAS, the live release rate of shelter animals has dramatically increased.

Each year, Friends of BCAS-subsidized low-cost spay/neuter clinics have significantly increased the number of fixed animals in Burlington County.

- Average subsidized cost of spay/neuter surgery for a cat: \$22
- Spending on advanced medical care for more than 700 cats and dogs, 2012-2017: \$163,460.53; without this care, the lives of these animals may have ended prematurely
- Number of active donors: 726
- Number of active volunteers: 235
- Volunteer hours donated in 2017: 37,509
